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FOREWORD

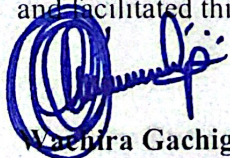

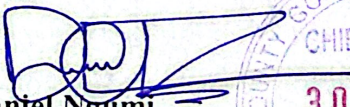

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report presents the outcomes of the public participation exercise conducted to inform the preparation of the Annual Estimates for the Financial Year 2026/2027.

In line with the provisions of Article 201 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 and the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, the County Government undertook structured public engagement forums to collect views and proposals from citizens and stakeholders. A total of fifteen (15) public participation forums were held, covering all wards across the county. The forums were conducted over a period of two (2) days, ensuring broad geographical coverage and inclusivity.

The primary objective of the exercise was to present the draft Annual Estimates for FY 2026/2027 to the public for review and comments, as well as to obtain additional views, proposals, and priorities from citizens to further refine the budget. This process enabled stakeholders to validate the proposed allocations, highlight gaps, and recommend interventions for improved service delivery.

Key thematic areas that emerged from the forums included:

- Improvement of road infrastructure and accessibility
- Enhancement of health services and facilities
- Investment in water supply and sanitation
- Support for agriculture and food security
- Youth empowerment and employment opportunities

The views collected from the public have been analysed and incorporated, where feasible, into the final Annual Estimates for FY 2026/2027. This ensures that the budget reflects the needs and aspirations of the people while aligning with the County's development agenda.

The County Government remains committed to strengthening public participation as a critical pillar of good governance thus enhancing mechanisms for citizen engagement in planning and budgeting processes.

CHAPTER ONE:

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

Public participation is a fundamental pillar of governance in Kenya, anchored on the principles of transparency, accountability, and inclusivity in decision-making. It provides citizens with an opportunity to engage in the planning, budgeting, and implementation processes of government programs and policies. In the context of county governments, public participation ensures that development priorities reflect the needs and aspirations of the people.

The preparation of the Annual Budget is guided by the need to allocate public resources efficiently, equitably, and in a manner that promotes sustainable socio-economic development. The key objective is to translate the County's policy priorities and development plans into a realistic financial framework that supports service delivery and addresses the needs of the public.

In developing the budget, the County Government is required to comply with the Constitution of Kenya, 2010—particularly the principles of public finance under Article 201—and the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, which set out the legal framework for budgeting. The process must be aligned with approved planning documents such as the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) and the Annual Development Plan (ADP), while adhering to set budget ceilings and prescribed budget calendar. Additionally, it requires meaningful public participation, stakeholder engagement, and consideration of fiscal responsibility principles, including prudent use of resources, transparency, and accountability. These requirements ensure that the final budget is credible, lawful, and responsive to the priorities of the citizens.

In line with constitutional and statutory requirements, the County Government organized structured public participation forums across 15 designated locations to gather views from the public. These forums provided a platform for the public to interrogate the budget proposals, offer recommendations, and enhance ownership of the budgeting process.

The input collected during these engagements was instrumental in refining the proposals of the annual budget to ensure they are responsive, equitable, and aligned with the county's development agenda and the broader objectives of fiscal responsibility.

1.2 Objectives of Public Participation

The public participation exercise for the Annual estimates for FY 2026/2027 was guided by the following objectives:

General Objective

To enhance transparency, accountability, and inclusivity in the budget-making process by engaging citizens and stakeholders in the review and refinement of the Annual Estimates for the Financial Year 2026/2027.

Specific Objectives

- To ensure compliance with constitutional and legal requirements on public participation.
- To present the draft Annual Estimates for FY 2026/2027 to the public for review and feedback.
- To collect views, proposals, and priorities from citizens and stakeholders to inform budget decisions.
- To validate the proposed programmes, projects, and resource allocations against community needs.
- To identify gaps, emerging issues, and areas requiring reprioritization within the draft budget.
- To promote public awareness and understanding of the budget process and county development agenda.
- To strengthen citizen ownership and support for the implementation of the approved budget.

1.3 Legal Framework

The preparation of the Annual Budget for the Financial Year 2026/2027 is anchored in the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, and the County Governments Act, 2012.

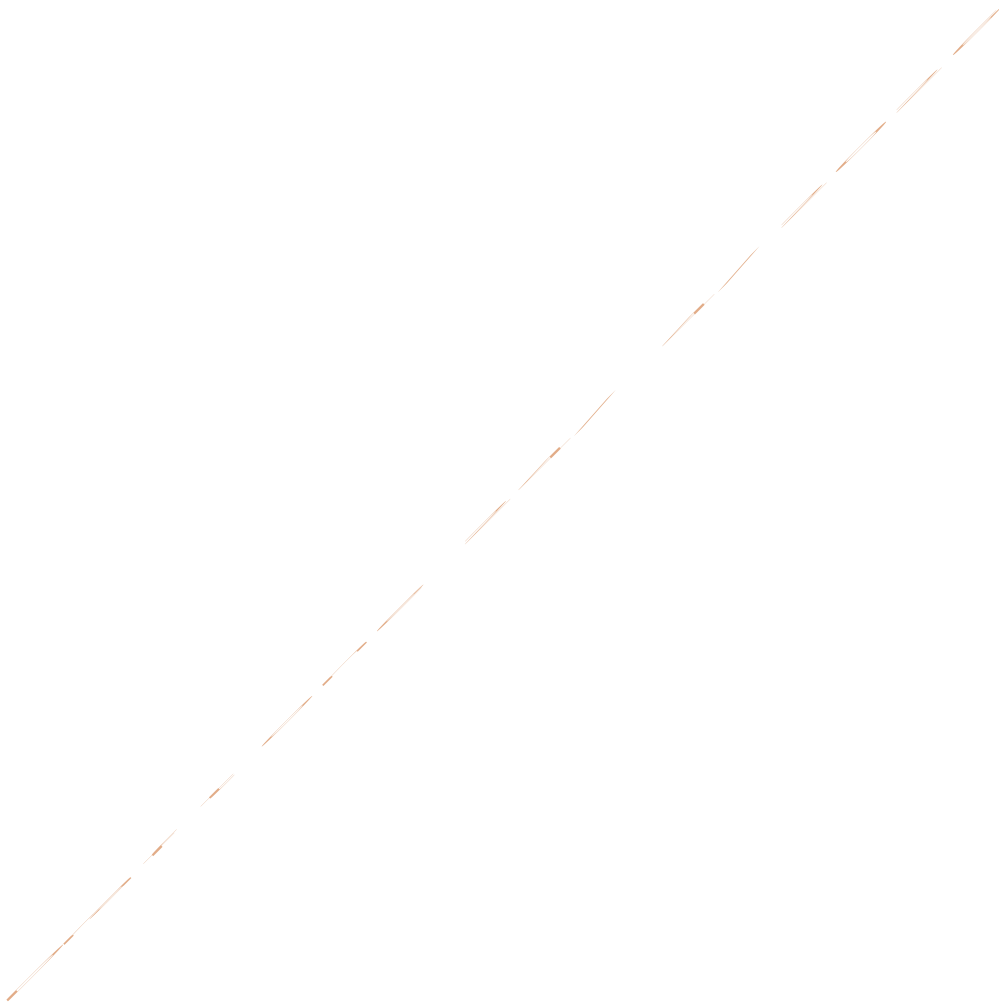
Article 201 of the Constitution outlines the principles of public finance, emphasizing openness, accountability, and public participation in financial matters. In particular, Article 201(a) requires that there shall be openness and accountability, including public participation in financial matters. Article 220(2) further provides that national legislation shall prescribe the structure of development plans and budgets for counties, while Article 224 mandates county governments to prepare and adopt annual budgets and appropriation laws in accordance with national legislation.

The Public Finance Management Act, 2012 operationalizes these constitutional provisions. Section 125 assigns responsibility to the County Executive Committee Member for Finance to oversee the preparation and submission of annual budget estimates. Section 126 requires the preparation of the Annual Development Plan (ADP), which forms the basis of the budget. Section 129 provides for the submission of budget estimates and supporting documents to the County Assembly by 30th April each year. Additionally, Section 117 underscores the importance of public participation in the budget process, particularly in the preparation of the County Fiscal Strategy Paper, while Section 87 sets out key principles of public participation, including inclusivity, access to information, and responsiveness to public input.

The County Governments Act, 2012 further strengthens the requirement for citizen engagement. Section 115 mandates county governments to establish mechanisms for public participation in governance processes, including planning and budgeting. Section 87 outlines the principles of citizen participation, such as timely access to information, reasonable access to the process, protection of minority and marginalized groups, and the promotion of transparency and accountability. Section 91 provides for modalities and platforms for citizen

participation, including public meetings, notice boards, information communication technology, and other appropriate mechanisms.

These legal provisions collectively ensure that the annual budgeting process is lawful, transparent, participatory, and responsive to the priorities and aspirations of the citizens.



CHAPTER TWO

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENTS AND STAKEHOLDER INPUT

2.1 Approach

The County Government adopted an inclusive and participatory approach in conducting the public participation exercise. The process involved physical public forums with stakeholder consultations to ensure broad-based engagement.

2.2 Public Participation Forums

A total of 15 public participation forums were conducted across the County. The forums were strategically located to enhance accessibility and ensure representation from diverse geographic and socio-economic backgrounds.

Each forum involved a presentation of the budget cycle, feedback on the 2024/2025 budget performance, budgeted allocations for 2025/2026, estimated resource envelope for 2026/2027, and the departmental expenditure ceilings with projects and activity proposals. This was followed by plenary discussions where participants provided their views and recommendations.

2.3 Data Collection and Analysis

Data was collected through oral submissions during the forums, written memoranda, and stakeholder inputs. The information gathered was systematically analyzed and categorized into thematic areas aligned to county sectors to inform decision-making. It was further summarized to align with the proposals presented during the meetings.

2.4 Feedback from Public Forums

The forums were designed to capture diverse views from participants. Each forum was moderated by county officials, with plenary sessions to allow groups to deliberate on sectoral priorities. Sign language interpretation was provided in Nanyuki and Nyahururu to accommodate those with hearing impairment.

2.5 General observations and recommendations

- To ensure that the views of the public are well articulated, senior officials of the County (CECM and C. Os) should lead the public participation process.
- There is need to allocate resources to facilitate participants with transport.
- There should be proper planning and coordination of public participation meetings to avoid parallel meetings.
- To ensure accountability to the members of the public continuous feedback on implemented projects should be provided during the public forums.

Observations:

- Need for the County government to enhance regulatory and enforcement action in response to reported cases where private investors have obstructed access through public roads
- Low levels of public awareness, participation, and community ownership and sustainability of development projects, calling for intensified civic education and sensitization programs
- There are instances of unregulated and exploitative pricing of water supply at Posta calling for strengthened oversight of private sector participation in essential service delivery (consumer protection).
- There is emerging security concerns at Posta livestock yard due to broken gates. There need to rehabilitate two (2) gates
- The lighting installed during the last financial year comprises five streetlights, not ten floodlights as previously indicated. Further, the installed lights are dim and do not provide adequate illumination for their intended purpose
- Lack of projects in Health Department which are critical in Sosian. Need to Establish a dispensary at Ol Mutonyi to serve Ol Mutonyi, Kahuho and Ngirachi

Challenges:

- Overlapping public participation sessions targeting the same stakeholders by different agencies resulting in low attendance and exclusion of important voices.
- Inadequate inclusion in public participation processes leading to unequal representation and limits the diversity of views captured
- Low public awareness and participation

Recommendation

- The County Government should strengthen regulatory compliance and enforcement mechanisms to safeguard public access roads
- Intensify civic education and public sensitization programs at community level

- The County Government should establish and enforce a consumer protection and pricing oversight framework for private water service providers
- The County to prioritize the rehabilitation and reinforcement of the two damaged gates at Posta livestock yard
- The County should undertake a technical assessment of the installed lighting system and replace the existing dim streetlights with appropriate high-mast floodlights
- Provide advance notice and clear communication to stakeholders
- The County Government should prioritize the establishment of a dispensary at Ol Mutonyi to improve access to healthcare services for residents of Ol Mutonyi, Kahuho, and Ngirachi

General observations

- Fast track the implementation of Rumuruti spatial plan to address land use conflicts and enhance development of the affordable housing projects.
- Support tree planting through provision of seedlings.
- Include department of health in the proposed projects for the construction of a morgue and septic system at the Rumuruti Sub County Hospital.

- Varying levels of understanding among participants, making it difficult for some community members to fully interpret technical budget proposals.

Challenges

- Overlapping public participation sessions targeting the same participants by different agencies resulting to conflicts and reduced effectiveness of engagement.
- Absence of key stakeholders, which slightly affected the flow and completeness of discussions
- Limited resources leading to unequal distribution of resources.

Recommendations

- Develop and share a joint public participation calendar among all relevant agencies to avoid scheduling conflicts and attendance.
- Ensure relevant leaders and technical officers are present during public participation forums to simplify technical information and enhance effective engagement.
- Promote fair and equitable distribution of development projects across all areas within the ward to ensure balanced consideration of community needs.
- Appointment of a committee to ensure that the projects proposed during public participation are the ones that are implemented.
- Allocate funds not only for new projects but also for **routine maintenance of existing infrastructure** such as roads, water systems and public facilities.
- Projects should be **completed within set timelines** to avoid stalled or incomplete projects that do not benefit residents.

- Low Public Interest and Apathy: The public often shows little interest in participating, especially if they feel their input won't change outcomes.
- There were some people who came to the public participation forum with an intention of inciting the public.
- Citizens complained and recommended for establishment for a clear channel for feedback, complaints, and monitoring of government performance.

Recommendation;

- They recommended for an allocation of sports funds for the youths per ward county wide.
- They recommended for rehabilitation of a zip lining at Thompson's falls.
- They recommended also for the rehabilitation of Manguo dispensary.
- They recommended for construction of a Studio for youths to support their talent and development.

General Observations and Recommendations

Observations

- There is discrepancy between the 2024/2025 project performance report and the actual status as no fish fingerlings have been distributed at Olmorano dam despite being documented.
- Community confidence in public participation forums within Olmorano region has declined. Residents perceive a lack of equitable development, noting that project implementation appears concentrated in the Sipili region, leaving Olmorano underserved.

- Children have to be escorted by parents to school due to the daily contending danger of drowning and parents waste a lot of time which otherwise can be used in other beneficial activities
- During rainy seasons when the river become swollen, vehicles cannot pass and therefore a lot of farm produce cannot be taken to the market leading to massive losses.

2.6 Outreach and Mobilization

To ensure broad participation, the County Government employed multiple outreach strategies. Announcements were made through Standard newspaper, local radio stations, and social media platforms. Religious institutions, were also engaged to spread information.

CHAPTER FOUR

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION

The public participation exercise on the Annual Estimates for FY 2026/2027 was successfully conducted across all wards, providing a structured platform for citizens and stakeholders to review the draft budget and submit their views. The forums recorded broad representation from community members, civil society, and sector stakeholders, demonstrating strong public interest in the county's planning and budgeting process. Key issues raised centred on prioritization of development projects, equitable resource allocation, improvement of service delivery, and strengthening accountability mechanisms.

While the majority of the forums were conducted smoothly, two forums experienced challenges related to insecurity, which disrupted proceedings and limited full participation. Additionally, it was noted that parallel meetings organized by various departments on the same day affected attendance levels in some areas, as stakeholders were unable to effectively participate in multiple engagements simultaneously. Despite these challenges, valuable feedback was still collected and documented for consideration in refining the budget estimates.

Conclusion

The public participation process for the FY 2026/2027 Annual Estimates was largely successful and fulfilled its objective of incorporating citizen input into the budgeting process. However, the occurrence of insecurity in two forums and the scheduling of parallel departmental meetings highlighted the need for improved coordination and planning in future engagements. It is recommended that adequate security arrangements be ensured for all forums and that stakeholder engagement schedules be harmonized across departments to maximize participation. Overall, the views gathered provide critical input that will enhance the responsiveness, inclusivity, and effectiveness of the final budget.

Way Forward

To strengthen compliance with PFM principles and improve the effectiveness of public participation, the following measures are recommended:

- **Deploy senior and technical officers** to lead and actively participate in public forums to ensure informed and meaningful engagement.
- **Institutionalize feedback mechanisms**, including timely dissemination of participation reports and clear demonstration of how public input influences final budget decisions.
- **Rationalize and better coordinate participation forums** to minimize duplication and reduce stakeholder fatigue while maintaining inclusivity.
- **Strengthen project prioritization processes** to ensure alignment with community needs, county priorities, and core service delivery mandates.
- **Provide structured facilitation support**, including **clear guidelines on transport reimbursement and participant facilitation**, to enhance inclusivity and attendance.
- **Leverage digital platforms and alternative engagement channels** to complement physical meetings and broaden reach.

In conclusion, while the County continues to uphold the legal requirements for public participation, addressing the highlighted concerns will be critical in enhancing transparency, accountability, and citizen confidence in the budgeting process.
